

"D" SERIES 1968 BROADCAST SHEET

This is a "D" Series, for 1968 built cars, Broadcast Sheet. The Shipping and Sequence Numbers on the Broadcast Sheet are the important numbers [refer to the article for further information]. The 1968 and before Broadcast Sheets are used by Chrysler car enthusiasts in finding the standard and optional equipment history of their car. It is actually an easier Broadcast Sheet to read than either the "E" or "F" Series, and those which Chrysler used until 1983.

"E" SERIES 1969 BROADCAST SHEET

"F" SERIES 1970 BROADCAST SHEET

This is a 1970 Broadcast Sheet previously shown (page 17). There are eleven lines. Line One's important information is the VIN and "Y" code (Build and Bank codes). Lines two through Five provide interior and exterior colors, standard equipment - depending on optional engine and suspension. Lines Six through Eleven are the car's extra optional equipment (non-standard items per model) that were ordered. The Broadcast Sheet for 1970 is a "F" Series sheet. Chrysler used the alphabet to code Broadcast Sheets. If you go towards the beginning of the alphabet you will be going towards 1960, and vice-versa.

[Left] This is a 1969 Broadcast Sheet. There are eleven lines. It is similar to the 1970 Broadcast Sheet [top right]. It is the same exact sheet at first glance, except for the eleventh line, although some of the categories appear on different lines. Each Broadcast Sheet, at the bottom, has a section for remarks. Example remark used on either Broadcast Sheet was 18 Trans Am on 1970 "F" Series Broadcast Sheet. The biggest difference between the "E" Series 1969 and "F" Series 1970 Broadcast Sheet is that the eleventh line was used for additions or options not listed in any of the previous lines.

ALL CODES THAT CANNOT BE BROADCAST ON THE ABOVE LINES WILL BE BROADCAST ON THIS LINE. THE COMPLETE CODE OR CODES WILL BE BROADCAST IN AN ALPHA NUMERIC SEQUENCE WITHOUT TITLE OR FIXED POSITION.

Broadcast line 11 just above the Remarks area was used to complete codes that weren't listed on the previous lines. Each additional code was broadcast on the 11th Line in an Alpha Numeric sequence without its title or fixed position.
